BIOGRAPHY ABOUT ONE OF THE WORLD'S GREATEST FLUTE PLAYERS WILL PREMIERE ON PUBLIC TELEVISION

At the time of his death (May 28, 1914 – May 18, 1989), *The London Times* described Geoffrey Winzer Gilbert as "the most influential British flutist of the twentieth century." His accomplished career as a professional musician - as well as his unique teaching methods - established a legacy that lives on in generations of flute students and performers to this day. Although constantly in the public eye during a long and distinguished career spanning sixty years, Gilbert was a very private man. This inside look into his life reveals much more than the consummate professional that he was. It also describes a dedicated musician, who did not let obstacles (including his voluntary enlistment during World War II) derail his musical advancement and success. **Geoffrey Gilbert: Gentleman of the Flute** introduces the esteemed professor as a loving man with a wonderful sense of humor, a compassionate nature and an extraordinary ability to help others reach their potential as flute players.

"The reason for this biography is to capture Geoffrey Gilbert's story and bring it all together now, so that those that follow us will know this part of flute history," Monya Gilbert said recently "... we are proud of our achievement and hope that others will take a joyful look at the life of a great musician who had a world-wide influence on the way the flute is played today."

Geoffrey Gilbert, a former professor at Stetson University in DeLand, FL, emphasized the importance of fundamental techniques and consistent daily practice. His students often refer to his methods as "revolutionary" and many of his pupils now perform professionally to great acclaim, or teach his methods to their own students – in the United States and all around the world.
